Raymond Miller passed out the proposed Dundee Fire Dept. budget for 2012. Miller stated that basically the budget has stayed the same except for the radio supplies section. There is an increase because the department needs new radios because by 2013 they will be on high band. Mayor Cratsley went over the budgeting plan for these radios within the next three years. Miller and Cratsley explained that the department is doing the best they can to get the best deal to save money.

Larry Howell inquired about the numbering on houses for emergency vehicles that Chief Miller brought to everyone's attention in the past. Miller explained the importance of having these numbers in place. Wright stated that Barrington hasn't made a decision of what they are going to do yet. He stated that cost is important but getting everyone to buy them and having them actually put them up is going to be even

harder. He said that it might be a joint venture between Barrington and Starkey.

Bill Holgate asked if there is gps in the emergency vehicles. Miller stated that he has to see the Mayor about getting a couple new ones in the ambulances. He stated that there is gps in the lead pumper truck and the mutual aid truck.

Judy Duquette let everyone know that there will be a summer recreational program for the youths again this year. She stated that the State is cutting the funding of a couple thousand dollars, but they figured out a way to keep it in place without passing the costs on to the towns. Next year they may need to ask for a little more to keep it going.

Mayor Cratsley stated that the bowling alley in Dundee is owned by Freedom Village now and they are working to help compensate for the changes due to funding. The workforce help that is usually offered to supervise at the beaches has been cut.

Larry Howell thanked Superintendent Wheeler, Louie Seeley, the Town of Barrington and the Town of Starkey for municipal sharing. He stated that it is working out very well. Ray Miller thanked Wheeler and Seeley for working with the Fire Dept. with the fire hydrants.

Assessor Tony DeStephen stated that the reval is almost complete. He said that Barrington will see an increase of 8%, Dundee 4% and the Town of Starkey 7%. Notices should go out in about one and a half weeks.

Wright expressed his appreciation for the good communications from the Dundee Fire Dept.

Mayor Cratsley requested March for the next tri-board meeting. The other Boards agreed.

The meeting adjourned at 7:35 pm.
