Wheeler brought up the County mowing contract. He doesn't like all the additional paperwork that they are requiring especially since they are paying by the mile. Castner stated that they should try it this year and see how it goes with possible changes for next year.

He let the Board know that CHIPS notified him that the Town will get approximately \$143,000 with an additional \$32,000 for Pave NY.

The new grader was delivered last Friday.

Sheriff Spike arrived and gave the 2016 statistical report for the Town of Barrington. It included all different 911 and emergency calls received from Yates County from the Town. It also includes a list of criminal arrests and sex offenders.

10. Public Participation on Agenda Items

Seth Olney wanted to know if the Code Enforcement report would be available to the public after the meeting. Deputy Nate Olney stated that it would. Perry stated that it is now attached to his voucher.

Chuck Tolbert stated that the last few months he hasn't been able to see the Code Enforcement report during the meeting. He stated that it is listed as an agenda item. Lange stated that the Code Enforcement Officer isn't required to attend the meetings, but does submit a report. Tolbert wanted the Board to go over the bullets of the report. Clerk Perry stated that is open to the public but it will cost a quarter a page or she can send it digitally for free.

Tolbert stated that the Board is violating the opens meeting law. Perry stated that it's up to the Board if they want to go over it verbally during the meeting but they do need to make it available to the public.

Seth Olney stated that on March 13th there was a stop work order that he was told was lifted. He stated that it must be part of the Code Enforcement report and wanted to know if it could be discussed. Lange stated that it could not be discussed because it's pending litigation. Olney stated that he heard that it was not.

Seth Olney had a couple more concerns. One regarding his attorney not being included in a suggested meeting to compromise the Olney case and the other was regarding his family being called liars. Deputy Nate Olney stopped the conversation.

Clerk Perry stated that she received three applications for the Ethics Board and one for the Planning Board.
